### Minutes for February 27, 2000

Carolyn reported that to date the total received is \$900.00 dollars, plus the \$200.00 dollars donated by Entergy, and not counting the reunion fund of 1990 which is between \$500.00 and \$600.00 dollars. She read the list of people who have joined and paid dues.

It was decided to place an order for Alumni tee shirts. The cost is \$6.05 per shirt plus a \$15.00 one time screen fee. The Bustin Through Bison was selected for the back. It was designed by 1960 graduate Billy Marcotte. Bob McCallie volunteered to contact him for permission to use his name.

In open discussion Bob McCallie donated his truck and trailer for a float in the Homecoming Parade. Those appointed by Peggy to be responsible for the float are: Bob McCallie, Ed Moran, Charles Best, Jimmy Daniels, Fred Perkins, Robert Perkins and Troy Chandler.

A motion was made and seconded that Fred Perkins be the Grand Marshall of the parade and Homecoming weekend, and he accepted.
