

**CHS Alumni Association**  
**Minutes**  
**January 22, 2006**

President Mike Calvert called the meeting to order with 10 members present.

Olivia Kegley made a motion to accept the minutes from the last meeting. Motion seconded and carried.

Treasurer Gina Ingle reported a balance of \$4106.94 in checking and a certificate of deposit for \$1250. The Treasurer's report was accepted as presented.

It was not felt that the mail out and purchased ad brought enough additional people to the event to offset the costs.
